Job Summary:

Lead Play Leader is in responsible for the supervision and safety of teen staff and program participants, while planning and implementing disguised learning activities that cater to the academic and social emotional needs of Youth.

Employment Status:

Part Time 25 hours per week, \$18-\$20/Hour Monday – Friday 1030am – 330pm

Job Functions:

- Build and influence positive relationships with participants, teens and staff
- Plan weekly or daily schedules taking into account children's age groups and interests
- Keep communication current with parents and program coordinator
- Lead recreational and educational activities
- Treat children, parents, and other teachers with respect and dignity
- Recognizes and responds to the individual needs of each child, and treats all children in a manner which is appropriate and helps build children's character an self-esteem
- Keep accurate records on program participants including attendance and meal count
- Perform other duties as assigned by the program coordinator
